What you'll do as the Community Living Support Worker:

- The primary function of this position is to provide meaningful, personalized support for children in their home and community.
- Perform safe transferring techniques and participate in all aspects of recreation and leisure activities (e.g. swimming).
- Promote and support Individual rights and facilitate meaningful community inclusion.
- Facilitate ongoing learning opportunities for personal growth and development of the individual.
- Facilitate opportunities for the development of personal relationships.
- Contribute to the development and implementation of personalized plans.
- Promote Positive Behaviour Supports and effective communication.

Qualifications:

- Education and experience working with children/youth with complex behaviours, mental health and health care needs in a residential setting and ability to work independently.
- Resourceful, Creative & Relatable (to the population you'll be supporting)
- Must be physically able to meet the demands of the job, such as lifting/transferring and recreational activities
- A positive and pleasant work attitude, effective communication skills and a solid understanding of consistent work practices are essential. This position will require working closely with parents, children, community members, school personnel.
- Preference will be given to candidates who are able to demonstrate a clear understanding of Social Capital

- The successful applicant must possess or be willing to obtain a valid B.C. Class 5 Driver's License, CPR and First Aid Certification and be able to meet all other CSCL employment criteria (e.g.: Criminal Record Search, MCFD Screening, Good Health Certificate, Food Safe Certificate, etc.)
